CKJH VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

PTSA ACTIVITIES & EVENTS

9th Grade Farewell- This is a chance for 8th grade parents to do something special for the departing 9th graders - includes setting up, cutting cake, making punch/coffee and serving the hordes.

Assemblies- Help spend money and offer your input re: entertaining and educational assemblies

Baking & Refreshments- Bake and provide refreshments for different activities, mainly school dances.

Book Fair- Man the money during daily sales; workers needed during school hours.

Box Tops for Education- Collect your box tops and turn them in to the office and/or help clip, bundle and mail for redemption.

Bulletin Boards- Provide occasional updates and seasonal decorating for PTSA bulletin board near main office.

CARES Program - organize school supplies provided to students in need.

Computer Work- Show off your clip art and computer skills with work on fliers and other forms.

Concessions- Jobs vary from purchasing supplies in bulk to selling concessions at after-school sports and activities.

Dance Chaperone- This could be your big chance to learn the latest dance crazes!

Emergency Preparation- We have a great shed for emergency preparation supplies. Help determine and prioritize needs, purchase supplies, and keep our students and staff safe.

Legislation- Washington State PTA has an incredible legislative program that includes a weekend at Legislative Assembly where concerned parents gather and determine the best ways to use the huge VOICE of PTA to speak to the legislature. Be a part of this plan and help inform CKJH PTSA members.

Phone Work- Do you like talking to answering machines? This is the job for you! Calls are made as reminders for upcoming events and to ask for help with the many PTSA activities.

Reflections- Jobs included in this super program are: judging entries (photography, literature, music, art, video, choreography) or finding judges, organizing entries and readying them for display, making certificates, ordering awards, helping at the Council Reception and returning entries.

School Pictures- This is done even before school starts at Maze Days. Call now if you are interested in helping. Includes helping fill out order forms, keeping lines moving, and fashion consulting. There will also be a retake day to take advantage of your skills.

Staff Appreciation- We love our staff all of the time, but we make a special effort to show it during Staff Appreciation Week. Includes helping with ideas for staff surprises and/or baking/cooking for the annual luncheon.

Talent Show- It's quite a big show. We need people for ticket sales, lighting, sound, programs, background design and stagehand duties.

Vision & Hearing Testing- We need volunteers to test vision and hearing. Training on-site.

SCHOOL ACTIVITIES

After School Academic Coach- Do you have some free time to help students who are struggling with school? Sometimes a one-on-one relationship is just what they need to get over the hump.

Band Parent- Often the band has something special going on, and communication has to go beyond trusting the student to relay the news. Phone tree members and organizers will help this person.

Classroom Volunteer- Mark this line and we will pass your name on to teachers who would welcome some extra hands and another adult in the classroom.

Distributing- Mainly four times per year; usually involves about 2 hours putting mailings and newsletters together, stuffing and sealing.

Home Ec Help- Extra hands and subject knowledge are helpful while cooking and sewing are happening.

Parent Walkabout- The lunchroom and hallways can get a bit crowded and crazy at lunch time. Extra sets of eyes, and just the presence of parents who care, have a calming effect. A training session will be held for those who are interested.

Science Fair Judge- You need not be a science expert to handle this job. If you enjoy seeing our young minds at work then this is your beaker of tea. Judging rubric provided.

Shadow Day Profession- Are you willing to spend half a day at work with a shadow or two? Eighth grade students are given a chance to learn about a career that they are considering and your input may be exactly what they need to make a life decision.

Test Proctoring - This involves monitoring students while they are testing.

Track & Field - Track & Field is one of the few non-cut sports at CKJH and an incredible number of students (200 plus) participate, making for many heats and many competitors. Volunteers are needed to time, measure and direct the controlled chaos.

Transportation- Most parents are accomplished chauffeurs. This is just another opportunity to increase the mileage on your car/van - includes field trip driving.
